Dear Families

End of Term 1... we made it.

After a very long and busy term, we have managed to make our way to the end of Term 1. Amongst, swimming, excursions, Harmony Day celebrations, Launching into Learning, NAPLAN, Interviews, Acquaintance Night, Athletics and School Photos, we have also managed to squeeze in a phenomenal amount of learning to best support our student learners on their academic journeys.

We have recently had a security system upgrade across the school. As part of this upgrade, additional security measures have been put in place, namely in the way of card readers / fobs being installed in the admin building and in Banksia building. Whilst these additional measures are fantastic in supporting us around student safety, they have also presented us with some additional issues such as allowing parents access into the admin and Banksia buildings. For anyone inside the school grounds, who would have entered via the admin, we have installed a door bell. This will notify admin, who will be able to press a button and let people in. Similar measures will be put in place outside each door of Banksia to alert the teacher that there is a parent / guest awaiting entry, as once the fences have been upgraded, the safety fences will also have card readers.



Exciting news for Banksia, that in these holidays, the yard area between Banksia and the library will receive a much needed upgrade. We were lucky enough to receive a grant from Variety Club. This grant (along with some school money) will see a climbing frame and soft fall installed, cubby house, sandpit, musical pipes and a few other pieces of equipment installed which will provide some much needed activities for our Banksia students to enjoy. In consultation with some Occupational Therapist students via the University of South Australia, we are hoping to have created an environment that meets the sensory needs of our students. We are all super excited to see how it all turns out when we return in term 2.

Unfortunately, there have been more and more days when we have a number of staff away and sadly frequently are unable to find relief teachers. We don't envisage that it will get any better next term when cold and flu season is also on us as well as whatever is happening with COVID at the time. We wish to express our thanks to the entire Playford Primary School community for their support and understanding when they have had to wait a little longer, or their child has ended up in a split class as we have been short staffed. Let's hope that next term it's a little more calm and settled for all concerned.

Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden

Our kitchen garden continues to go from strength to strength. Ideally, we would love lots more support in the way of volunteers in the kitchen and the garden. Volunteers will need to have a Working with Children Clearance (WWCC) and RHAN (Responding to Harm, Abuse and Neglect) as well as completed our simple volunteer induction. We are more than happy to help support you in getting all things ticked off. If you are interested in helping in the kitchen, the garden or both (or you know someone who is - grandma, grandpa, even a next door neighbour) then we will pay for the WWCC and support you / them in getting the requirements complete in readiness.



Uniform

As you are well aware, we are in a uniform blitz at present. We are trying to ensure that all students are wearing the correct attire. You would have recently received a letter from the school (via Edsmart) informing you of the dress code / uniform policy, and also the process that school staff will follow for students not wearing the correct uniform. This policy was updated (via staff, Governing Council and community consultation) and ratified by Governing Council at the end of last year and therefore is an expectation that students who attend Playford

Primary School wear the correct uniform. If for any reason you are having difficulty in managing this, please contact the school and see what supports we can provide. Quite simply, unless we are aware, we are not able to help. As part of our uniform policy,

students also need to wear hats whilst in the yard (and in PE when outside). Students that do not have a hat at play times need to remain in the shaded area by the library. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Student Illness

Over the last few weeks, we have had a few waves of student sickness. Our student services has resembled a sick room or the waiting room of a busy hospital. We cannot stress enough the importance of keeping your children home if they are not well. There was some sort of vomiting / gastro bug circulating, as well as Covid and then the common cold. We are struggling as it is to find staff to hold the fort when class teachers / ancillary staff are unwell, so if your children are sick / showing signs of temperature or illness, you must keep them home at least a full 24 hours from the last symptoms to ensure that we are not spreading any illness. Given the close proximity in classrooms, illness can spread quickly. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Breakfast Club Changes – Term 2

Due to an ongoing issue in accessing large quantities of bread, we have taken the opportunity to revamp the way in which we run breakfast club here at PPS as of term 2. Each day next term, we will be offering a different sort of food for breakfast that those students who haven't had the opportunity to have breakfast at home, will be able to access. So from the generous donations of some bread from Woolworths as well as fruit, milk and cereal via Kickstart for Kids, in addition to some additional offerings via the school (food as well as teachers volunteering their time) we will be offering a wider array of foods. Students will have access to the dining room in the kitchen, so will be expected to sit down to eat and be responsible for tidying up their mess and stacking the dishwasher after they have finished eating. Whilst we will never turn a child away if they are hungry, we do ask that you have a chat to your children about whether they need to access breakfast club. The foods and days of availability are in a table below. We also plan to do other random breakfasts on occasion too dependent on the availability of foods.

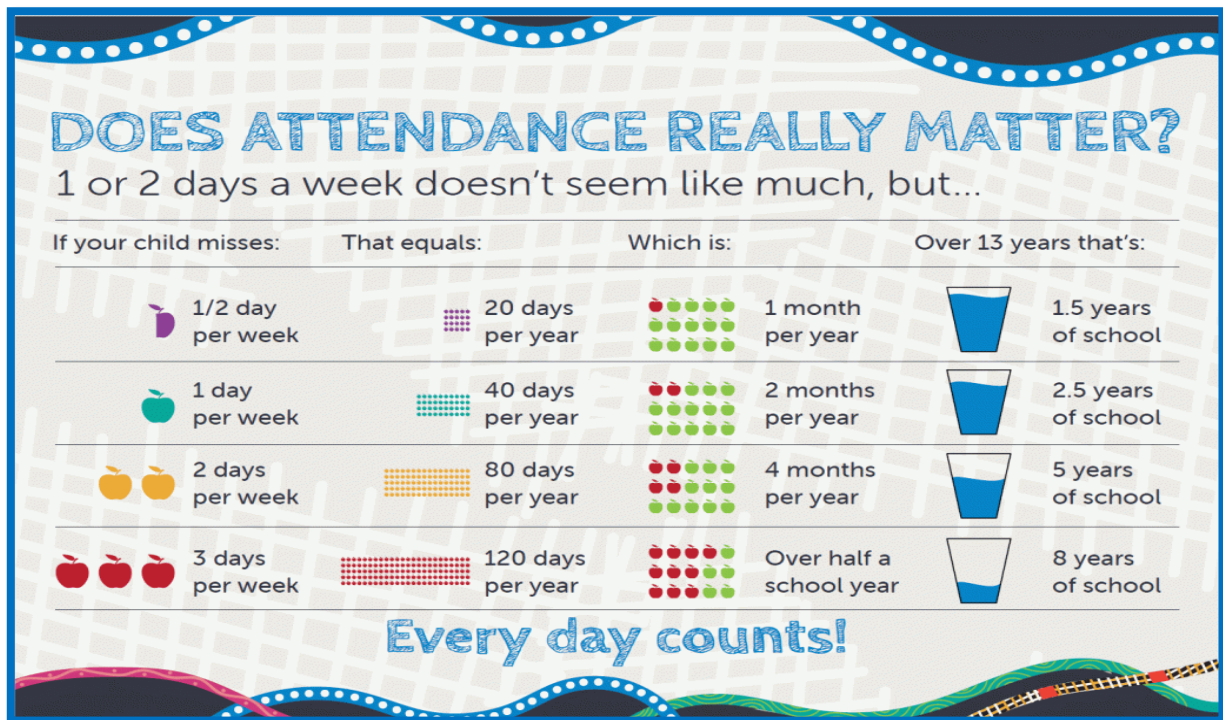

The Education and Children's Services Act 2019 and the Regulations impose statutory responsibilities in relation to attendance at school.

The Education and Children's Services Act 2019 also requires that a child must either:

- attend the school at which they are enrolled on every day the school is open and at all school activities the school requires the child to attend
- participate in the approved learning program in which they are enrolled.

Parents have a responsibility under the Education and Children's Services Act 2019 to ensure their children attend school regularly. If a child or young person does not attend, without a 'prescribed reason' for their non-attendance or an approved exemption, their parents may be guilty of an offence.

Parents must enrol their child in an education program as per department policy or, at minimum, from 6 years (the age of compulsion) in line with the Education and Children's Services Act 2019. Parents must:

- enrol their child or young person in a school or approved learning program
- provide information to the school that may help planning for the child's learning, for example medical conditions, developmental milestones and family complexities
- ensure their child attends punctually on every day the education program is offered and to comply with the education program being offered
- provide an explanation to the school whenever their child is absent
- where appropriate, apply for an exemption when they wish to take their child out of school, such as for a family holiday
- work with the school on intervention strategies to improve attendance

ANZAC BISCUITS

Ingredients:

1 cup rolled oats	125g butter
1 cup plain flour	2 tbsp. golden syrup
1 cup brown sugar	2 tbsp. hot water
1 cup coconut	1 tsp bicarb soda

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C.
2. Mix together oats, flour, sugar and coconut in a bowl.
3. Melt butter and syrup in saucepan over medium heat.
4. Mix bicarb soda with hot water and add to saucepan. (mixture will foam up)
5. Add liquid mixture to dry ingredients and mix well.
6. Put teaspoons of mixture 5cm apart onto a greased oven tray.
7. Cook for approx. 15mins. Biscuits will spread during cooking. Cool on tray

World Autism Awareness Day

On Tuesday the 2nd of April, it was World Autism Awareness Day. This day was for raising awareness, acceptance and inclusion around autism.

Autism is a neurological developmental difference that affects the way an individual relates to the environment and people in it. The effects differ from individual to individual, which is why the term 'spectrum' is used. It reflects the fact that everyone's lived experience of autism is different.

Individuals on the spectrum may have skills in particular areas, while finding other aspects of life particularly challenging. How skills develop across a life span varies as much as autism itself and can vary from person to person.

The theme for World Autism Awareness Day was **colour**. This theme celebrated the vibrant lives of autistic individuals, highlighting strengths, interests and differences.

Students engaged in conversations with the use of picture books, which told heart-warming stories about children who are on the autism spectrum, making friends and how everyone could feel supported. They reflected on what their true colours are, and decorated biscuits filled with colours as well as imprinting on their own strengths. The Nest was also open for quiet sensory play, to provide an alternative from what can be a loud stimulating play outside.

Supervision and safety

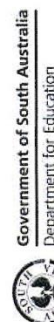
You need to:

TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL

Early Term 2, families will be sent an email with a link to complete the application for secondary school online. Please ensure your email address and residential address is accurate and correct with our school.

Families will need to complete their child's application online before the due date to ensure their nominated secondary school is considered. While families are able to nominate to attend any secondary school out of zone, the increase in enrolment demand from in-zone students may mean there is limited space available. It is recommended that families consider alternative secondary schools if applying for an out of zone secondary school.

We also encourage families to visit their local (zoned) secondary school before deciding on their final nominated secondary school/s. Information on open days, principal tours and/or information evenings is available on the secondary school's website. Alternatively, families can contact the secondary school/s directly. If you have any queries, please don't hesitate to contact our Front Office.

Fees are due by Friday 12th April

Payments can be made at the Payment Office every morning from 8.30am-9.15am or via our secure Payment Slot in the Front Office any time during office hours. If you would like to pay your fees in instalments please contact the Payment Office to complete a Direct Debit instalment plan. STARTING PRIMARY SCHOOL

In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception.

From 2024, children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.

Registrations of interest are now open to start school in the 2024 mid-year intake.




