Prestige Cabinets Kitchens and Robes for supplying us with some very cheap (pre-cut) wood so that our students can make items such as a wooden box for Pokemon cards, jewellery etc. For those unaware, we created kids shed to stimulate friendship groups, foster confidence, encourage strong behavioural choices, support student in developing greater resilience and

advancing communication and collaboration skills. At the same time, students will learn valuable 'woodworking' skills in a safe and supported environment. Students don't use any power tools, but they do use hand held tools once they have been safely inducted into their use (drills, hammers, wood saws etc). At the end of the project, students then get to keep their item to take home. The feedback over the last few years has been very positive and well received by the students involved and their families.


We wish you a happy and safe holiday break and for those who celebrate Easter a great Easter break. We hope that you can all enjoy the time with your family.

A lot of students really enjoy coming in to The Nest and checking to see what their pulse is using the pulse monitors and then checking again before going back to class to see the changes in their pulse rates after following the steps in The Nest to help them Self-Regulate. Students are able come to The Nest for Self-Regulation Breaks when needed during the day, there are also students that attend small group sessions that focus on developing Interoception awareness and social skills.







ATTENDANCE



Thank you all, for making an amazing effort this term to make attendance matter. We have had lots of parents replying to the text message with reasons for absences, which is great. Remember you can reply to the text message or ring the office to let us know of your child's absence. Any absences over 3 days require an exemption form which can be collected from the front office or student services. Encouraging your child to be a regular attender at school

TIPS FOR ATTENDANCE

- Arriving early and on time can boost your child's confidence for the day, putting them in the right frame of mind for learning and achievement.
- Learning is a progressive activity. Each day's lessons build on the previous day's lessons.
- Arriving late or leaving early often can lead to gaps in learning. This might mean your child misses
 out on blocks of learning. They might miss out on important social activities.
- School is often the first place a child learns the importance of being on time.
- Being punctual and having good attendance helps develop good habits that are important at schoo and later at work.
- Late arrivals can impact the whole class, as teachers might have to stop the lesson, repeat
 instructions, and regulate the emotions of the students, leading to lost teaching time.

Autism Inclusion Site Visit and Autism Awareness Day

A couple of weeks ago, Playford Primary School were lucky to have a visit from Rachel Hughes (Senior Psychologist), Amanda Michalanney (Inclusive Education), and Perry Rush (Inclusive Teaching and Learning Director), from the Statewide Inclusive Education Services. Their visit focused on what my role has looked like as the Autism Inclusion Teacher at Playford, and to celebrate the achievements made over the last few years during this initiative.

A key part of being an Autism Inclusion Teacher, is to ensure that all community members can build their capacity at understanding neuro-affirming practices and celebrate the ways in which all brains work differently.

Last Wednesday (2nd of April), was World Autism Awareness Day. This was a day which enabled students to build a level of understanding between neurotypical and neurodiverse brains and to understand strengths that all individuals embody. There was a range of activities for classes, resources

which were shared, and an opportunity for quiet sensory play in the Nest.



ANZAC Biscuits

125g (4½ oz) butter
2 tablespoons golden syrup
1 cup (90g) rolled oats
1 cup (80g) desiccated coconut
1 cup (150g) plain flour
½ cup (110g) caster sugar
¼ cup (55g) brown sugar
½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

- Set your oven to 180°C (350°F) and line a baking tray with baking paper.
- ☐ In a small saucepan over low heat, melt the butter and golden syrup together. Remove from the heat and set aside.
- In a bowl, mix together the oats, coconut, flour and sugars.
- Mix the bicarb with 2 tbs of boiling water in a small bowl. Stir into the butter-syrup mixture, then pour this into the oat mixture. Stir until all the ingredients are well combined.
- □ Roll the mixture into heaped-tablespoon balls and place on the baking tray, leaving about 5cm (2 inches) between them.
- Bake for 12 minutes: they should be pale golden and quite soft. Leave on the tray for 5 minutes, where they will darken and set enough to be lifted to a wire rack. Leave to cool completely.

TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL

STARTING SECONDARY SCHOOL



Early Term 2, families will be sent an email with a link to complete the application for secondary school online. Please ensure your email address and residential address is accurate and correct with our school.

Families will need to complete their child's application online before the due date to ensure their nominated secondary school is considered. While families are able to nominate to attend any secondary school out of zone, the increase in enrolment demand from in-zone students may mean there is limited space available. It is recommended that families consider alternative secondary schools if applying for an out of zone secondary school.

We encourage families to read the "<u>register your child's interest for starting high school</u>" page on the department's website: https://www.education.sa.gov.au/parents-and-families/enrol-school-or-preschool/school-enrolment/register-your-childs-interest-starting-high-school

We also encourage families to visit their local (zoned) secondary school before deciding on their final nominated secondary school/s. Information on open days, principal tours and/or information evenings is available on the secondary school/s website. Alternatively, families can contact the secondary school/s directly. If you have any queries, please don't hesitate to contact our Front Office.

MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGES (SCHOOL FEES)

Fees are due by Friday 11th April



Payments can be made at the Payment Office every morning from 8.30am-9.15am or via our secure Payment Slot in the Front Office any time during office hours. Payments can be made over the phone during office hours using your credit card. Receipts will be sent home via the class courier bag. If you would like to pay your fees in instalments please contact the Payment Office to complete a Direct Debit instalment plan. If you would like to pay your fees by direct bank deposit please ensure you include your child's Student ID and if known, your Family code, when making the payment.


